If you purchased Broiler Chicken for commercial use from January 1, 2008 through July 31, 2019, you may be eligible for benefits from some class action settlements.

Summary:	The proposed class of Commercial and Institutional Indirect Purchaser Plaintiffs alleges that between January 1, 2008, and July 31, 2019, Defendants and co-conspirators conspired to fix, maintain, stabilize, and/or raise the prices of Broilers, resulting in overcharges to commercial and institutional indirect purchasers of Broilers. The complaint describes how the Defendants and co-conspirators allegedly violated federal and state antitrust, unfair competition, and consumer protection laws by agreeing to fix prices and restrict output of Broilers.
Eligibility:	In order to be eligible to receive a payment from the Settlements your business must have made a Broiler purchase indirectly from Defendants or their alleged co-conspirators in one of the following states between January 1, 2008, and July 31, 2019: Arizona, California, Connecticut (for the Amick Farms settlement only), District of Columbia, Florida, Hawaii, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, Vermont, West Virginia, and Wisconsin ("Indirect Purchaser States"), for its own use in commercial food preparation.
