If you are an Illinois organization who purchased televisions, monitors and/or notebook computers containing LCD flat panels between January 1, 1998 and December 31, 2006, you may be entitled to a substantial payment resulting from a class action lawsuit

In Re Illinois v. AU Optonics Corp., Case No. 10 CH34472 in the Circuit Court of Cook Co., Illinois

SETTLEMENT FUND: \$104,646,436.00

FILING DEADLINE: October 4, 2016

PERIOD OF CLAIM: January 1, 1998 to December 31, 2006

SUMMARY : This class action lawsuit, brought by the Illinois Attorney General on behalf of the State of Illinois, accused multiple corporations of raising and maintaining the price of thin-film-transistor liquid-crystal-display (TFT-LCD) flat panels. Due to the alleged price-fixing conspiracy, Illinois residents were overcharged for LCD devices according to the lawsuit.

ELIGIBILITY: Illinois consumers that purchased products containing a TFT-LCD Flat panel (“LCD Product”) from a retailer or someone other than the manufacturer of the component flat screen between January 1, 1998 and December 31, 2006 are eligible to receive a payment from the settlement funds. TFT-LCD flat panels (thin-film-transistor liquid-crystal-display panels) are the glass display panels used in many flat screen televisions, monitors, notebook computers, and color-screen cell phones and other handheld devices.
